IOWA CITY — Cedar Rapids Kennedy's offensive line dominated the line of scrimmage, but it was Iowa City West that seized the moment last

Trailing 9-0 midway through the third quarter with a moribund offense hampered by penalties and turnovers, the Trojans somehow managed to put together two touchdown drives and win the season opener for both teams, 12-9.

The key play was a fourth-and-15 from the Kennedy 33. Kennedy sent a blitz but the Trojan offensive line gave West quarterback Aaron Bleil time to find junior receiver Gabe Huinker in the middle of the field. With the defense spread, Huinker was able to juke his way free and take a serpentine path into the end zone with just 1 minute, 59 seconds left.

The score shocked the large crowd after Kennedy had seemed to be in control with the dominance of its line. Kennedy ground out 178 rushing yards using primarily three runners.

But with the Cougars up 9-0, West responded with a 54-yard drive set up by a nice John Milani kickoff return. The key play in that drive was a

Indians run by Mustangs

MOUNT VERNON It's rare to classify a season opener as a "must-win" game.

But given the gauntlet of future opponents awaiting the Marion Indians, last night's game at Mount Vernon fit the bill.

Marion overcame an early Mount Vernon defensive touchdown and overran the Class 2A newcomers, 28-6, in a non-district game.

"We didn't know what we had, we graduated a lot of people,' Marion Coach Tony Perkins said. "We make new mistakes.'

Marion (1-0) got rid of those mistakes with a relentless rushing attack, outrushing the Mustangs 234-17. The loss spoils the debut of **Mustangs Coach Lance** Pedersen, who came to Mount Vernon after a successful 10-year run at Class 1A Wilton.

Mount Vernon opened the scoring when defenseman Ryan Muller scooped up a Kory Walsh fumble on Marion's first play from scrimmage and rumbled eight yards to put the Mustangs up,


