## Kennedy pours it on Jefferson after half

Cougars go from 17-7 lead to 52-7 victory

CEDAR RAPIDS — From battle to blowout.

The Cougars produced points from a clock-melting drive before the break and two quick touchdowns after it for a 52-7 victory over Cedar Rapids Jefferson in non-district competition last night at Kingston Stadium. The Cougars are 2-2, winning their second straight game.

Kennedy wasn't satisfied with a 17-7 halftime lead, after burning 4:58 off the clock and settling for Alex Stone's 28-yard field goal with four seconds remaining in the first half.

"We just went in there (locker room) and said we were going to correct things and come back out to go to work," Kennedy Coach Brian White said. "They took it upon themselves and realized they weren't playing to their potential. We didn't need to light that fire."

Terrell Jordan provided the spark. He returned the opening kickoff of the third quarter to the J-Hawks' 15. Four plays later Nick Duehr rushed for a 2-yard touchdown, making it 24-7

Less than a minute later, Duehr scored another touchdown, hauling in a pass from Brian White Jr. for a 27-yard score.

"The return was the ignition," Duehr said. "We saw that and everybody jumped aboard and did great from there on out."

Duehr has developed into a triple threat, running, receiving and passing the ball. He had more than 100 total yards, including 51 receiving and 38 rushing.

"I like going out wide sometimes," said Duehr, who caught a short pass and reversed field during his touchdown reception. "I have some pretty good speed so when he

throws me out there it is fun."

Rizaiha Maide provided two first-half scores to put the Cougars up 14-0 with 8:13 left in the second quarter. He scored on runs of 6 and 4 yards.

He finished with a teamhigh 105 rushing yards. The Cougars totaled 300 yards rushing.

"He's a tough running back," White said of Maide.

The Cougars have allowed just one touchdown in the last eight quarters, outscoring opponents 94-7.

Jefferson (0-4) got its lone score when Myles Glassberg squirted through the Cougars for a 10-yard TD run.
