TigerHawks dominate 1 vs. 2 battle

Class 2A's top-ranked North Fayette Valley was up to the challenge.

The TigerHawks plugged a variety of hard-nosed rushers into their systematic Wing-T attack and swarmed their opposition with suffocating defense as they transformed a highly anticipated showdown with No. 2 Union into a landslide victory, 56-21, at Ron Wymer Field in West Union.

Tanner Kuhens rushed for three first-half touchdowns, including an impressive 36-yard score in which he followed his blocks to the edge and broke a pair of downfield tackles, before finishing with 90 yards on 14 carries.

Jesse Mackey set the tone for the TigerHawks when he ran 51 yards untouched for a score off a third-and-10 counter on the game's opening drive and finished with 138 yards and two touchdowns on 15 carries. Chase Hollinrake added a 92-yard touchdown run on a counter in the second half and quarterback Tate Hovden also scored from 8 yards out, while North Fayette Valley's defense helped widen the gap.

OTTUMWA 0 — B.J. White completed 21 of 24 passes for 227 yards and three touchdowns as the Cougars kept their playoff hopes alive with a road win.

White also rushed for 50 yards and scored a TD. Nic Duehr caught 8 passes for 113 yards and three TDs and Rizaiha Maide rushed for two TDs.

Johnson Mator led a defense that limited Ottumwa to under 100 yards with 10 tackles, a sack and interception.

I.C. REGINA 42, COLUMBUS COMMUNITY 7 — Brady Bigley and Jacob Phillips both scored two touchdowns and Michael Conlon passed for two as top-ranked Regina picked up its second straight lopsided road win.

Bigley scored on a 4-yard run and 85-yard interception return, Phillips on 28- and 8-yard runs and Conlon passed 44 yards to Jack Jensen and 12 to Noah Felderman.

WEST BRANCH 28, TIPTON 14 — Luke Lenocho rushed for 194 yards and three touchdowns as West Branch outscored host Tipton 14-0 in the final quarter.

With a win in Week 9, the Bears (6-2, 5-1 in 1A-3) can clinch their 24th playoff

berth.
